
communities. The traditional sacred music of Hinduism will be performed by Sridhar Chari, flute player, Anita Das, violinist and Venkat Ramakrishnan, mridangam player.

They will play the traditional Marathi song: Brindavani Venu, while a Barathanatyam dance will be performed by Govind Pallai, evoking the magic character, the spiritual, entrancing beauty of Krishna's flute: how the mere sound of that flute would cause all the animals, all the trees, all of nature

and all humans to freeze in absolute awe at the spiritual depth of his melody. They would be tranquilised, captured, immersed, perhaps in a trance? The song ends in a crescendo where the dancer himself goes into a mesmerising spiritual trance, representing how music (i.e.

Krishna's flute) is capable of taking us to a transcendental place, a third dimension. This is a spiritually powerful piece, and musically very appealing.
